

Deacon Jesse Walker was born August 21, 1930 in Houston, Texas. He was the fourth of seven children of Rev. Leon Walker and Sister Christine LaBor.

He was educated at Yates High School. He received his Bachelor of Science degree (Biology) and a Master's degree (Administration), after serving in the military.

He was joined in Holy Matrimony with Delores Hooks on September 9, 1956. To this union two daughters were born, Carolyn Christine and Susan Marie. Jesse was preceded in death by his wife and his daughter, Carolyn.

Early in his career Mr. Walker and family moved to Denison, Texas, and he was employed with Denison ISD. The Walker family moved back to Houston, and Mr. Walker became employed with HISD for 40 years where he served as an Assistant Principal at Burbank Junior High School.

Deacon Walker accepted Christ at an early age and became a member at St. John Baptist Church on Dowling street. He served on the Deacon Board for 50 years and taught Sunday School as well.

He joined Wheeler Avenue May 23, 2004 under the leadership of Pastor Marcus D. Cosby, where he served as a member of the Deacon Board and became affiliated with the Sunday School.

He was a member of Buffalo Soldiers and the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity. He provided service at St. Luke's Hospital and served his country as a soldier in the United States Army.

He is survived by his daughter, Susan Walker Brown; sister, Mattie Walker Perry; grandchildren, Gaylon D. Walker, Daniel G. Jenkins; twins, Nina and Naomi Walker; his dear friend, Juanita Harris and a host of nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.


















