

## Reflections Of Life DEACON SAMUEL WOODBERRY

On January 5, 2021 at 6:37 pm, the heavenly shades of night were drawn, another scene ended, the book was closed and another Faithful Servant called Home.

Deacon Woodberry departed this life with the full assurance, he fought a good fight, he finished his course and above all he kept the faith. He was surrounded by his loved ones.

Samuel Woodberry was born December 5, 1932 in Clarksville, Texas to Lemuel and Eliza Woodberry who preceded him in death.
